Today we welcome our new vicar, David Woelmer, his wife Elizabeth, and their daughter Ellie. David is originally from Plano, TX. He and his family will be with us for one year, concluding his vicarage in July 2022 before completing one more year of coursework at the seminary. Lord willing, he will receive a call to the Office of the Holy Ministry in April of 2023.

Having a vicar with our congregation is exciting! But it is also a “new thing” for us at Churubusco. So, what does a vicar do? On Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings, Vicar Woelmer will do many of the same things our fieldworkers do: assist with the liturgy, help distribute Holy Communion, and preach from time to time. He will also have many opportunities to teach. But an even more important aspect of vicarage (think “internship”) is the experience of being full-time at the church. He will be in the office while I’m in the office, make visits with me, study the Scriptures and the Confessions with me, and begin to learn more fully what the vocation of “pastor” entails.

It is our fervent prayer that our time spent with Vicar Woelmer will be fruitful, that we might serve him even as he serves us, and that our time together will glorify God’s name and grow His Kingdom!
